History — Built in 1833 by Colonel E. B. Morgan, an original investor in *The New York Times*. Known first as Aurora House, later as Wayside Inn. Deeded to Wells College in 1943.

Lodging — 10 guest rooms, including 2 suites
Views of Cayuga Lake and Village of Aurora, listed on National Register of Historic Places
